COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Crime Scene Photography is much more than a “point and shoot” exercise. The thorough and professional documentation of crime scenes and evidence is an important skill to master. Our photography course will begin with how the camera works, the different exposure modes, and how light is evaluated in order to record a quality image. The lessons will then move towards composition and documenting crime scenes with the camera. A thorough examination of a crime scene is a planned and thoughtful process and the class is designed to help students process their crime scenes in a meticulous and quality manner. In addition, students will be given the skills necessary to evaluate challenging photographic subjects, solve those challenges, and record true and accurate photographs that are admissible in a court of law. Special photographic challenges such as macro photography, impression evidence, low-light and flash photography will be presented. The course is an interactive introduction to crime scene photography and is designed for those investigators wanting to improve their skills and abilities in crime scene photography.
