COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Fire, Arson, and Post-Blast Investigations crime scene Processing is an inclusive and practical 40-hour course of precise instruction designed to aid investigators and officers in processing of fire and explosives crime scenes. These investigations are often influenced by dynamics uncommon to most usual crimes. Fire and explosive investigations can occur naturally, accidentally, or intentionally with many criminal cases focusing on political, religious, and complex financial motivations. These cases are often difficult to prove the perpetrator and can make apprehending and convicting a suspect difficult for investigators, prosecutors alike. Arson and post-blast investigators will not only utilize initial response laws, NFPA publications 921, 1021, and 1033 in conjunction with departmental policies but also many other established resources to complete a thorough and accurate fire and post-blast crime scene investigation.
